When Lordsburg College was established in the converted Lordsburg Hotel, our very first library was "a circular room on the first floor, with many wide windows" with a collection of 2,500 books! Moving from Lordsburg Hotel to Founders Hall to Hoover, the Library moved back to the corner of 3rd and D Street, this time into a converted grocery store.

Honoring the generosity of the Wilsons, the Wilson Library was dedicated in February, 1996, and was characterized as "a beautifully designed, fully equipped, state-of-theart Library and Academic Center constructed to take future generations of students well into the 21st century."

Scores of students have walked in and out of this building, meeting with fellow classmates, cramming all night for finals, spending hours with our dedicated librarians to ace that research paper! Demand Driven Acquisitions

What is Demand Driven Acquisitions?

Demand Driven Acquisitions (DDA) is a program that allows us to provide thousands of eBooks to faculty, staff and students. We only pay when those titles are used. When a DDA eBook is used 3 times, we add it to our permanent collection. You might not know it, but you're helping us build our eBook collection!

DDA titles are selected by our librarians and this growing list has nearly 14,000 titles valued at \$669,000. Since 2013, DDA titles have been used over 2,100 times and you've helped us add 92 titles to our permanent collection – all at less than 10% of the valued price.

During the summer the library added print and electronic books making our collection grow to nearly 150,000 titles. We also increased our online e-journal collection to over 100,000 titles. We upgraded the ProQuest database to ProQuest Central, expanding access to include resources such as Arts & Humanities Database, Biology Database, and Nursing & Allied Health Database.
