

#### Migrating to a New Library Software

Effective July 1, 2020, Wilson Library will be moving to a new library software which necessitates withdrawal from the LINK+ service.

The decision to leave LINK+ was based on the following:

- Usage over the past three years has dropped 36%
- Only 32% of libraries in the system are academic libraries
- Over 50% of our costs go towards supporting public libraries borrowing from us

We will keep you posted as we transition out of LINK+ and move to another feature within the Interlibrary Loan (ILLiad) resource sharing service. We appreciate your patience as we make this significant transition in order to better serve the teaching, learning and research endeavors of our university.

#### STEM Grant

Title III HSI STEM Grant funded the purchase of 800+ e-book titles for the Library's STEM collection. This significantly upgraded the collection as 80% of the STEM holdings at the Wilson Library was published before 2000. The average price of a STEM academic book ranges between \$120 and \$130. These collections will provide access to the most current scientific literature and improve the quality of resources available to support student and faculty learning, teaching and research needs.

With the STEM Grant, the library was able to purchase the following: Science Classic Archive; Wiley Life & Earth Sciences 2018 Ebook collection (69 titles); EBSCO Ebook Collections (769 titles) - Allied Health 2018-2019, Robotics 2018, Energy & Green Tech 2018-2019, Doody's Core Essentials 2018-2019, Sports Med & Physical Therapy 2017-2019, Math & Statistics 2018-2019, Biology & Life Sciences 2018-2019, Chemistry & Biochemistry 2018-2019, Computer Science 2018-2019, Earth Sciences 2018-2019.

The Title III HSI STEM Grant assists with strengthening institutional programs, facilities, and services to expand the educational opportunities for Hispanic students and other underrepresented populations. In the past three years, the Grant funding has allowed the institution to implement a summer bridge program, peer mentoring program, faculty learning communities, and provide proactive services for both students and faculty.
