Institutional Review Board

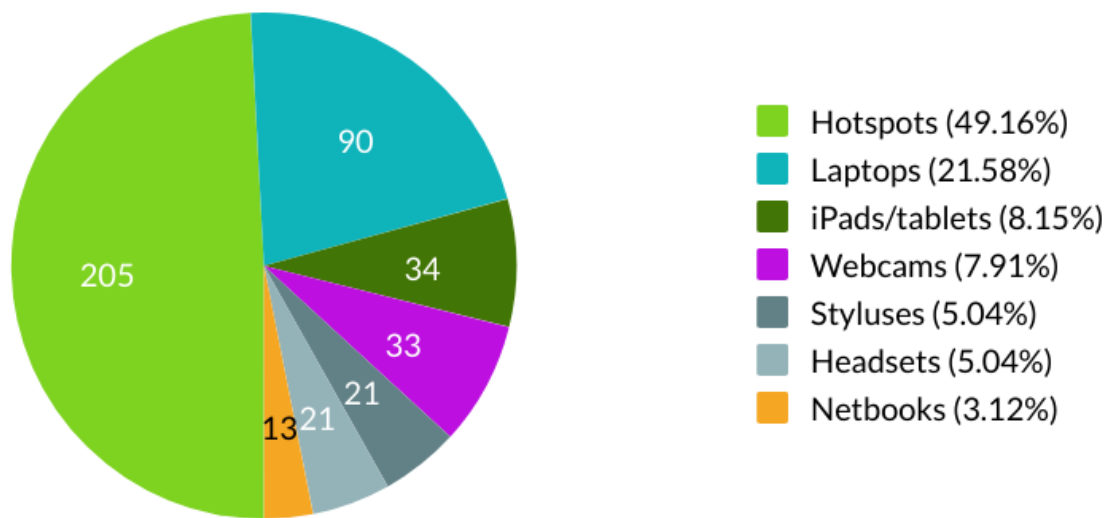

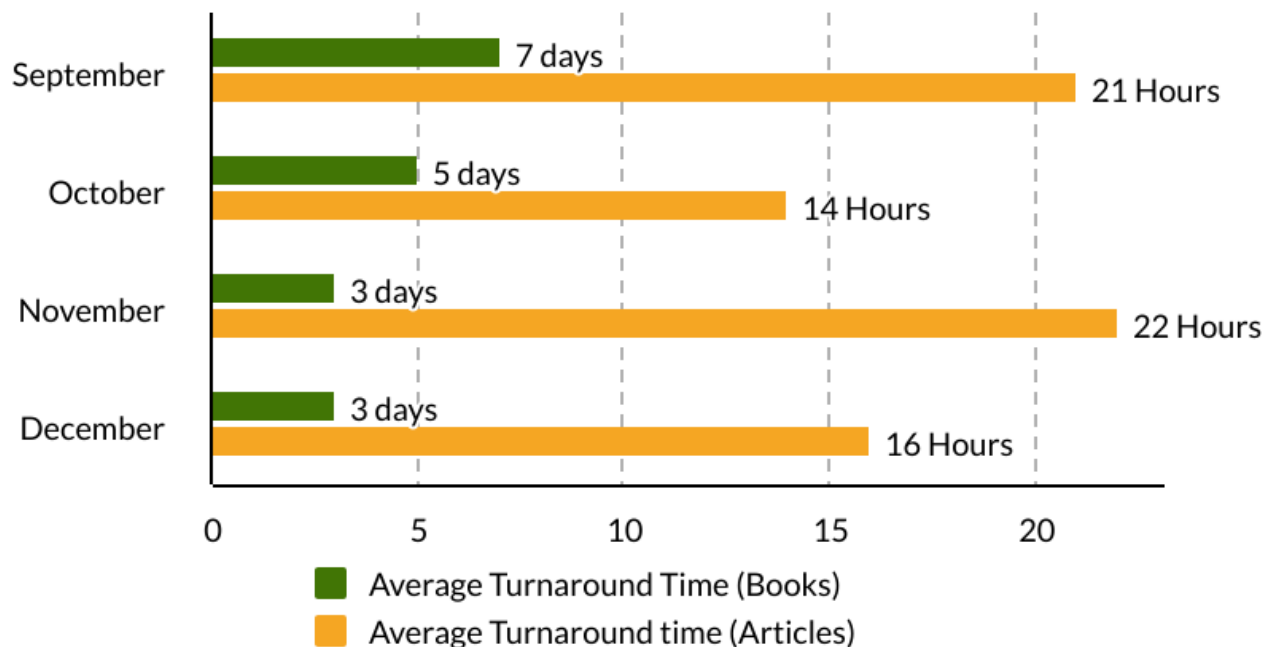
E-resources acquired during Fall 2020 Turnaround was about 3-5 days

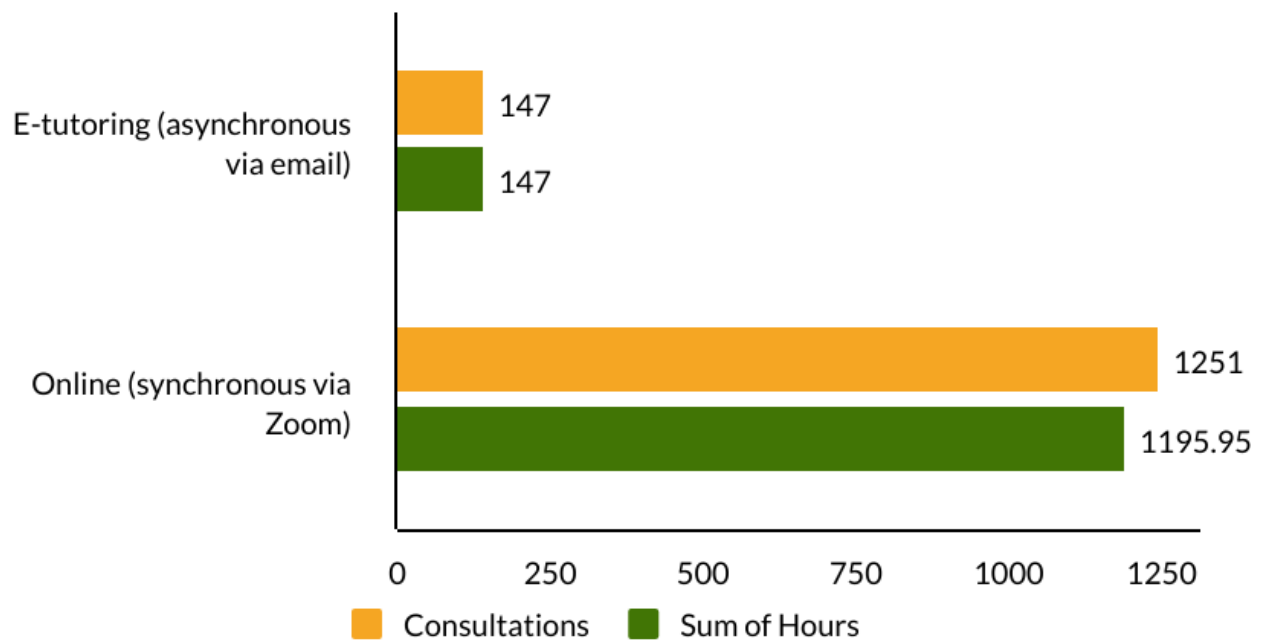
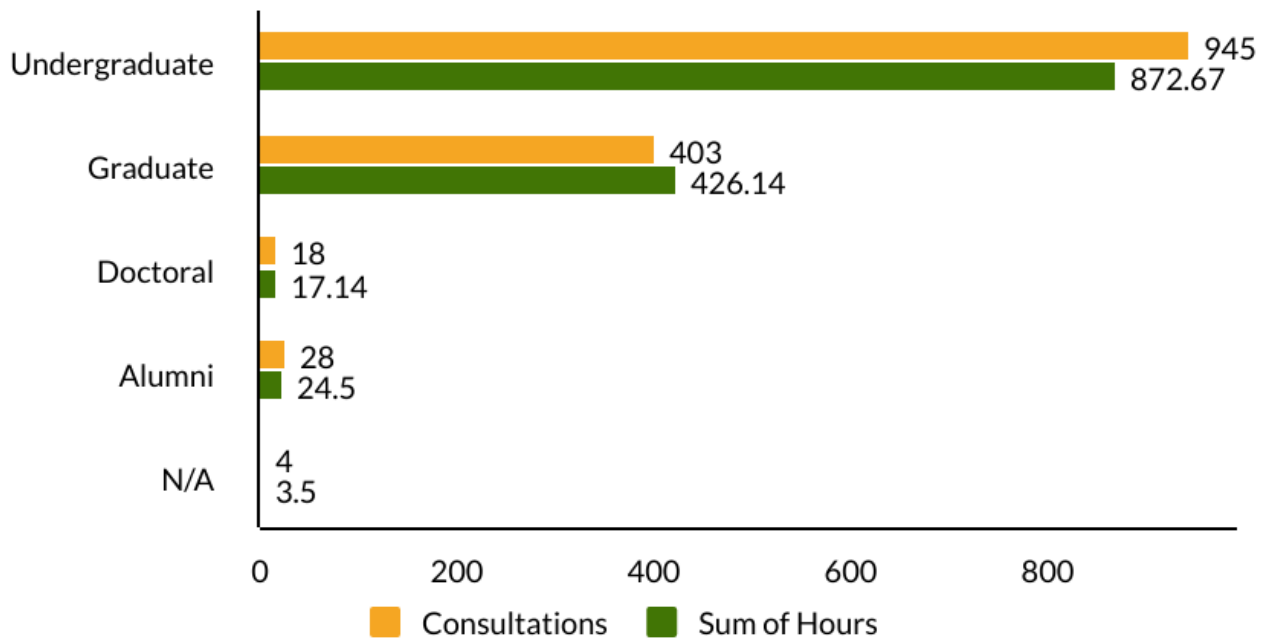
ASC Classroom Support:

Fall 2020 - 25 courses were supported via Student Learning Assistants during Fall 2020, serving a total of 510 students. 216 class sessions were attended by SLAs, 51 group sessions were offered, and 356 office hour sessions were conducted.

Spring 2021- 27 courses are supported via Student Learning Assistants during Spring 2021

ASC Tutoring Support

Fall 2020: The ASC held a total of 1398 consultations, serving 798 students. Of these students, 399 were new users of ASC services.
